Yes, Rudy, you don't know whether you're coming or going, but look at yourself. When did you last ever show her? My child needs to know I'm here. Please don't speak to Rick. Get out of this room. Rick, open this door. If you don't open this door, I'll... Rick, coming in, you... I asked the doctor they had there how long they could keep him in, and he said indefinitely. Right.
